

Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery Grants

The Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery (RTBR) Grants program is a \$10 million program announced under the Australian Government's Bushfire Recovery Fund. This program forms part of the Australian Government's \$76 million tourism recovery package to protect jobs, small businesses and local economies. The RTBR Grant has been developed in consultation with the National Bushfire Recovery Agency, and will be administered by Austrade.

There are two streams available to eligible Local Government Authorities and Regional Tourism Organisations under the program.

Objective and goals of the Grant

The RTBR Grant will support fire-affected regions to assist with the recovery efforts, and encourage international and domestic visitors to come back to the regions.

Stream 1 — Supports small-scale projects and events (including the promotion of these events). Applicants may apply for more than one grant in this stream, up to a total value of \$30,000 per applicant.

Stream 2 — Supports larger projects and events (including the promotion of these events).

Eligible activities under the Grant include but not limited to:

- Funding for bespoke events, concerts, festivals and/or other permanent visitor attractions such as art installations and tourist walks.
- Business events such as conferences.
- Social media, promotional and public relations activities including visitor guides, video, photography and other media to support the eligible activities.

Eligibility

Eligible applicants under the program are Local Government Authorities and Regional Tourism Organisations operating in local government areas activated by state or territory governments for Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements assistance for the 2019-20 bushfire season.

Individual organisations are not eligible to apply.

Applying for a Grant

Eligible Local Government Authorities and Regional Tourism Organisations have been formally invited to apply online. Applicants are strongly encouraged to partner with other eligible organisations within their region to lodge joint applications. Applicants are also encouraged to partner with community and industry groups where relevant.

Stream 1 — Applications will be assessed as they are submitted. Applications close 5:00pm (AEDT) Friday, 18 December 2020. Funded Stream 1 projects to date are listed on [Grant Connect](#).

Stream 2 — Applications have been assessed following the closing date. Applications closed 8 May 2020. Funded Stream 2 projects are listed on [Grant Connect](#).

Applications

Applications must be submitted online via the SmartyGrants portal. Eligible applicants have been sent a link to the online application form. A preview of the application form can be provided by contacting the ADS & Program Delivery team.

Assessment

The Minister for Trade, Tourism and Investment the Hon. Simon Birmingham has appointed an expert panel to work with eligible organisations and encourage partnerships in tourism regions. The Panel will also provide advice to the Austrade Delegate on assessments for Stream 1 and Stream 2 applications.

Applications will be assessed against the assessment criteria and an overall demonstration of value for money. Stream 2 is a semi-competitive round and applications will be assessed on merit and considered need and impact in different areas.

Applications will be assessed on the following criteria:

1. Project alignment with program objectives and outcomes (50 points)
2. Capacity, capability and resources to deliver the project (50 points)
3. Overall demonstration of value for money.
