China International Import Expo (CIIE) is the world's first import dedicated national level expo, hosted by the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China and Shanghai Municipal People's Government.

#### **About the event**

Austrade will lead the Australian participation at the China International Import Expo (CIIE, <u>China International Import Expo</u>) in Shanghai in November 2025, through a Team Australia Pavilion (located at **food and agricultural product** hall) and associated trade promotion activities.

The China International Import Expo (CIIE) is the world's first import and biggest themed expo at national level. It is a six-day multi-sector trade show for imported products. It is held at the National Exhibition and Convention Centre (NECC), world's largest single block building and exhibition complex.

Austrade has been supporting Australian businesses and brands with their participation at CIIE for the last 7 years. We work in collaboration with states, businesses and partners to deliver high-value, high-quality goods and fantastic Australian lifestyle to Chinese consumers.

The 8th CIIE will be held from 5-10 November 2025 in Shanghai China. Austrade is inviting Australian businesses from **food and agribusiness** sectors to join us at the Team Australia Pavilion which will be located at Food and Agricultural Product Hall of CIIE 2025.

# **OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises**

The <u>OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises</u> are internationally agreed standards for responsible business conduct the Australian Government expects enterprises operating overseas and multinational enterprises operating in Australia to comply with.

The Guidelines provide voluntary principles and standards for responsible business conduct in a variety of areas, including:

disclosure

- human rights
- employment and industrial relations
- environment
- combating bribery, bribe solicitation and extortion
- consumer interests
- science and technology
- competition
- taxation

The <u>Australian National Contact Point for Responsible Business Conduct (AusNCP)</u> leads the Australian Government's work to promote the OECD Guidelines and help resolve complaints relating to their implementation.

The OECD Guidelines supplement Australian law and are not legally binding.

#### **Resources and tools**

The <u>OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Business Conduct</u> and related sectoral guidance help enterprises identify and mitigate adverse impacts in their operations, supply chains and other business relationships.

The <u>OECD e-learning Academy</u> offers free self-paced courses that are open to all stakeholders interested in learning about responsible business conduct and risk-based due diligence.
